We'll cap the evening with lively entertainment from comedian Dennis Regan, who has appeared on both *The Tonight Show* and *Late Night with David Letterman*.

Many committees will be meeting in person or by teleconference over the summer to carry out important business in preparation for the Triennial. And in the next few weeks, we'll also be sending out the initial packet to delegates containing their hotel and meal reservation card plus other convention materials.

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Summary of Fraternal Leaders Advisory Group (FLAG) Teleconference Call - May 7, 2015

At this meeting, the group discussed the following:

- An update on the status of chapter delegate elections and next steps, including the first mailing to be sent to delegates in mid-late June.
- Plans for a meeting of FLAG to take place on the morning of September 25, at the convention hotel. More details will be shared at the July meeting of FLAG.
- An overview of activities planned for Friday afternoon and evening of the Convention. This will include the Society of St. Vincent de Paul Friends of the Poor Fun Run/Walk to be held at 2 PM on Friday, September 25, on the campus of Marquette University.
- Review and discussion of FLAG appointees to Convention Committees. FLAG will provide appointments to the final two Convention Committees at the meeting in July.
- FLAG members were asked how they feel members "experience" Catholic Financial Life. The group felt that members do this through their advisor, through the activities sponsored by chapters, and through our member benefits. In order to grow, they felt that we need to strengthen the relationship between advisors and members, and always ensure that members have a positive experience when interacting with our organization.
- Members of FLAG were asked to provide ideas for new member benefits, and to consider how the Society can recognize and reward members at various milestones anniversaries.
- The Michael James Mette concert series was well-received, with one concert in Texas and four in Wisconsin. Four more concerts are scheduled for the New England area in fall, and Michael will also perform at the upcoming Triennial Convention.
- There are many upcoming regional summer events to which members and their families have been invited.
- The next FLAG meeting is scheduled for Thursday, July 16, at the home office.

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
